Good article in KATU

There was an excellent article on KATU news Friday March 5th (inserts below) also another excellent article on March 8th. We had an excellent write up in the Oregonian including our very own Emri. With lots of coverage, things are looking promising.

Multnomah County District Attorney Mike Schmidt is one of three prosecutors supporting reforms to Measure 11 sentencing along with Wasco County DA Matthew Ellis and Deschutes County DA John Hummel. The changes the trio support include ending mandatory sentences, giving judges more discretion, and giving people time off for good behavior.

Quote from the article writer = "critics of Measure 11, including some prosecutors, said it gives prosecutors too much power over the sentencing process".

"I think judges are in the best place to balance and weigh everything and then come up with, hopefully, a decision that fits the situation and the crime," Schmidt said.

Critics of Measure 11 said there is still a lack of consistency under the current system that shows up in the plea-bargaining process. Ultimately, Holbrook and others want the judge to make the final decision.

"I'm definitely not somebody who supports criminal behavior or is advocating for being complicit in criminal activity," Holbrook said. "Other states do it; we've done it before. It's possible to be able to punish people adequately, and judges still have authority to be able to give a tough sentence to somebody who deserves it."

Bills on Reduction in Sentence update

SB 191 & SB401 are still in committee waiting for Public hearing dates. HB2172 is scheduled for Public Hearing 3/18/21 1:00pm. HB2002 had 2 Public hearings and is now waiting for House Judiciary Committee work. GOOD NEWS.... there were many more advocates for this Bill than detractors.

Emailing & mailing

Questions from emails and letters we have received:

- What % would they get? Answer: You can check your %. Each AIC might be a little different depending on sentence. Every six months you are given a "FACE Sheet". Toward the top you will see "Earned Time Computation" with your % of what you have earned so far. Now it says "not eligible". With the Sentence in Reduction bills, "not eligible" will change for those that qualify.
- Would we qualify if it's not retroactive? Answer: At this time we are not sure how the other 3 bills would work with not being retroactive. As soon as we find that information out, we will let you know.
- Please help me with my case. Answer: We cannot give advice on your personal case. We are not lawyers nor work for DOC nor the government.
- Please let me know any updates. Answer: Updates will be sent out as we get them. Our newsletters, sent out once a month is always up to date.
- Rumors on time frame and passing of bills. Answer: Please note the approximate dates on time frame below. NO bill has passed nor is on the Governor's desk.

TIME FRAME for **YES VOTES** - once passes, goes to the next time frame

- Mid March - Contact Senate Council Members (below in green)
- End of March - Contact all Senators
- End of April - contact all Representatives
- End of June - contact our Governor
